

ECMS Migration in PROD – where we are

PROD Migration journey	Description				
Currently: Step 2	The Connectivity Set-up and Execution phase				
	 The phase started on 2nd April 2024 as planned, and green-light to CTPYs was provided throughout second half of May by each NCB at national level. 				
	 The CTPYs were expected to test their U2A and A2A connectivity: 				
	 U2A connectivity via the Administrator user created by the NCB for the CTPY (based on the registration forms) 				
	✓ A2A connectivity via the A2A users created by the Administrator user of the CTPY				
Until today, 21 June	Time for CTPYs to finalise their connectivity testing				
2 August – 26 Sept.	Testing the connectivity will not be possible.				
	If you have not yet successfully tested your U2A and A2A connectivity testing, please do so ASAP.				

ECMS Migration in PROD – updates to the migration process

The CTPY users will be deactivated in ECMS for most of the **pre-migration phase**, and the users are then reactivated once the CTPY activities are expected.

For the **migration weekend**, NCBs can request their counterparties to access ECMS and run some tests. For this a specific window is scheduled at the end of the migration activities.

Please note, this is to be decided by each NCB.

ECMS Migration in PROD – next steps Counterparty set-up of refence data

Scope (what?)

After the capture of counterparty registration form data and other data (such as accounts and pools) by the NCB, the Counterparties should:

- Capture their own remaining reference data under their direct management, i.e., the remaining users and their access rights
- Verify that the data created by the NCB based on the registration forms is correct.

ECMS Migration Tests – involvement of CTPYs

Given the fact that counterparties may also be requested by their NCB to access ECMS during the migration weekend, then the participation of counterparties in the upcoming migration tests is also conditional to this.

Therefore, the counterparties may need to participate in the upcoming tests in UTEST environment:

Each NCB shall directly communicate this to the counterparties.

ECMS Migration Tests – involvement of CTPYs

MT9 (2nd part), MT11 and MT12 will include a rehearsal of the preparation week and migration weekend phases. Therefore, the actors are expected to execute the activities scheduled for those phases.

Counterparties do not have any specific activity during those phases, except potentially an activity requested by your NCB, for example accessing the ECMS on the weekend.

Hence, only those activities, if any, would be required from counterparties in the upcoming tests.

However, please note that during the preparation week and migration weekend the NCBs will be executing the migration of transactional data, including Credit Claims.

So, on the preparation week, the NCBs will need to provide to the counterparties the new Credit Claims ID (which is generated automatically be the ECMS, upon registering of the credit claim).

ECMS Migration Tests – involvement of CTPYs

Despite the CTPY participation in the test or not, it is important the CTPY actors respect the execution of the migration test by:

- 1. Only executing the activities you have been requested to perform,
- 2. Executing them at the time requested.
- 3. Respecting the environment availability by not carrying out non-migration tasks in the environment while a migration test is ongoing.

Unwanted activity may create disruptions or unnecessary effects on the test, and these tests are fundamental for the validation of the migration strategy for PROD.

The same is expected in PROD, i.e., execute only the activities requested and when requested.
